

Diamond Princess Cruise Had Positive Swab Diamond Princess Bella

In a shocking turn of events, a swab taken from Diamond Princess Bella, a passenger on the quarantined Diamond Princess cruise ship, has tested positive for COVID-19.

Bella, who is in her 70s, is the first passenger to test positive for the virus since the ship was quarantined on February 4th. She is currently being treated in a hospital in Japan.

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The news of Bella's positive test has sent shockwaves through the cruise ship community. Many passengers are now worried that they may have been exposed to the virus.

The Diamond Princess has been under quarantine since a passenger who disembarked in Hong Kong on January 25th tested positive for COVID-19.

The ship is currently docked in Yokohama, Japan, and the passengers are being tested for the virus.

So far, over 100 passengers and crew members have tested positive for COVID-19. The ship is expected to remain under quarantine for at least two more weeks.
